#### **Shop Notes**

• Brent. Thank for supporting the November events. I would like to see if there is interest in a Cornhole tournament at the upper building. If so, let me or Nichole know. Watch for a future announcement.

Apparel and Licensing. Harley Davidson is

offering some great deals on apparel. Let us order something if you don't find it in our inventory.

- Parts. Check out the clearance area for some new good deals.
- Service. Winter is here and most of us have covered up the bike or trike in the garage. It can easily be out of site and out of mind. Our service team in the shop would like to remind us that there are steps we can take to assure our Harleys will be ride ready when those winter sun breaks occur.
- Fuel stabilizer. Add some fuel stabilizer to that FULL tank of gas. This will avoid gas from going bad and keep moisture to a minimum.
- Tire pressure. Tires can lose as much as 2 psi per month. Check those tires
  periodically when storing your bike.
- Battery Tender. Keep your battery charged through the winter with a battery tender to assure adequate cranking power.
- Sales. Check in with Julie about new and pre-owned bikes. The showroom is full right now so let Julie guide you on the deal if you are looking to make a change.



### Winter Weather Got you Down? Slo-Joe Ranier

This is a good time to work on your 2024 bucket list. Here are some ideas to think about in the comfort of your home on a cold and wet winter day.

• US Route 66 is a must ride to see the way things were in the past. Many things to see and do can take up to 15-20 days to explore depending on your route.

- Ride to Alaska, the last frontier. Plan on 15-20 days for this 5,300 to 5,500 adventure. A trip to Alaska takes a lot of planning but is not a hard trip and worth the effort. The roads are in good shape most of the way but there will be some construction.
- The granddaddy ride is the 4 corners which will see your odometer mileage increase 7,500 to 8,500 miles. The ride can take up to 25 days depending on how many states you want to cover. If interested, contact Southern California M/C Association. Here is a web link to learn more.
